



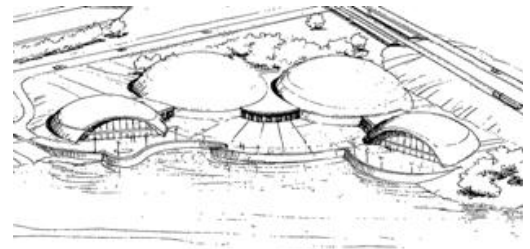
# New Museum Design

The Sixties Museum will feature a multitude of design features that are designed to reduce energy costs by as much as 40%, according to Jan Pedersen, museum president. The use of dome technology provides significant energy savings and also allows for a building that contains minimal support structures. "This will allow us maximum flexibility in designing our exhibits".

While the location is still in negotiations, the museum is progressing with its design. The structure will be tornado and earthquake proof, fire resistant and will provide for unobstructed exhibits.

In addition to the energy savings associated with the design, the museum will incorporate state-of-the-art lighting and display technology aimed at reducing operational costs. After all, the Sixties played a critical roll in the development of the Environmental Movement and efforts to Save The Earth.
