Final drawings of the proposed Sixties Museum campus were unveiled this week. The building is very environmentally friendly, and will cost 40% less to operate than a traditional structure. In addition, the lack of internal support beams will allow unobstructed exhibits! The building will cost 20 million

dollars to build and will sit on 20 acres on Chicago's Southwest Side.
